Collection of Children During The Day

Please note that if you need to collect your child from school during recess (10:45 – 11:15) or lunch (1:25 – 1:55), this will only be possible by prior arrangement. Please notify your child's teacher in advance if you will be needing to collect your child during break times and the teacher will arrange for your child and their belongings to be at the front office for you to sign out.

If you arrive at school to collect your child during break times without prior arrangement, you will be required to wait in the office until the end of the break time when your child returns to class to collect them. Thank you for your understanding.

School Grounds

As the perimeter gates are locked during each school day from approx. 9.00am until 2.50pm, <u>anyone</u> who enters the school grounds during these times will need to first sign in at the Front Office. This is a stipulation from the Department for Education for the safety of students, staff and community.

Student Daily Absence

As of Term 4, if a parent or caregiver hasn't notified their child's/children's classroom teacher or the Front Office the student will be marked as 'AU' (Away – Unexplained). At 10:30am each school day an automated email will be sent to the parents/caregivers notifying them of this absence. This new system replaces the individual phone calls Front Office staff were having to make each day. Please ensure you notify the school of any lateness or absence on each school day.

Student State Representatives

Congratulations to Kirsty S & Macy A who represented the School Sport SA State Team at the School Sport National Championships in Darwin at the end of Term 3.

Kirsty competed in the Long Jump and she also qualified for the 100m and 200m. Kirsty's performance was exceptional as she set a new PB for herself of 4.92m. Although she jumped the same distance that the 3rd place winner – on count back Kirsty finished 4th. This is a huge improvement from her results during the 2018 SAPSASA Athletics meet in Melbourne.

Macy also competed in the Long Jump and made it to the top 8, earning herself an 3 extra jumps. She managed a 3cm PB and came 8th overall. In her combined event (Long Jump, 100m, Shot Put & 800m) Macy came 8th overall and managed PB's in all the events. She came equal 2nd in her 100m race and also managed a 13 second PB in her 800m.

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HOW I MADE MY PAINT



One of our site improvement goals is working towards developing students' cognitive engagement in the classroom with a focus being on student agency in learning along with inquiry and STEM dispositions. Sharing of learning is a major component of inquiry learning and developing dispositions. So here is a focus article by a student to share with you.

I got to create my own investigation which I really enjoyed. I wanted to share with you why it was fun to create my inquiry and how I did it. I attempted to create paint using ingredients around the house.

Firstly, I had to mash my strawberries with a mortar and pestle so juice would come out of the strawberries. I strained it in a strainer when the juice was not coming out I put water in a mortar and pestle then mashed the strawberries again. Next I put them in the strainer and strained them. I did it again, and again, and again, and again until there was no more juice coming out. I got about a half cup of strawberry juice. It looked like a lot because a half cup came out of only four strawberries!

I added three tablespoons of icing sugar and vanilla yoghurt and gave it a mix for about a minute and a half. Next I used the stick blender so there was no clumps in it. I added about one tablespoon of flour and stored it so it was mixed together. I tried adding one aloe vera leaf to make it thicker but it didn't work. So I tried a wafer biscuit and it made it thicker so I added about ten. I had to wait for it to soften and then use the stick blender again.

Next, I colour it so it would look pretty. I coloured it blue because blue is my favourite colour. Adding gold glitter made it sparkle. I had my finished paint. It was so good and thicker like paint.

A couple of days later I discovered that it had thinned out. It actually got better. Particularly its feeling and colour.

What I learnt from my inquiry was the science of mixtures. I discovered that paints gets thinner after a couple of days or thicker. I also learnt that colour can fade after a while. One thing I would continue on is probably trying to make more samples and making more colours so other people can use it. The biggest struggle was making sure that is didn't go mouldy or watery so people like it and want to paint with it. I want to keep exploring with more time.
