2019 Materials & Services Fees

Staff Carpark

As stated in the adherence that was sent home to all parents and caregivers dropping off and collecting children from the OSHC & Vale Park Primary School, the Staff Carpark located on the school grounds (entrance off Arundel Street) is strictly for **STAFF ONLY** between the hours of 7:45am and 4:30pm.

We recommend you park on either Tonkin Street, Arundel Street or Washington Street to drop off or collect students. Please <u>DO NOT</u> use Ascot Avenue as this has an enforced Bike Lane and is also a <u>NO STANDING</u> zone on the school side. Please ensure you read and obey the street signs for any conditions or time restrictions.

Student Absences

A reminder to the Vale Park Community that if your child is going to be absent from school due to sickness or family reasons can you please ensure you let the Front Office know. This can be done by ringing the school on 8261 3733 at anytime. Please leave a voicemail message if you are unable to speak to any of the Front Office staff.

Additionally, you can send an email to <u>dl.0967.info@schools.sa.edu.au</u> to notify the Front Office staff.

For all absences that are more than three (3) days due to sickness a medical certificate from a doctor will need to be provided.

If your child is going to be away for an extended period of five or more days you will need to speak with the Front Office staff about completing an Exemption Form.

The Vale Park Community is reminded that students are not permitted on the Vale Park Primary School grounds until 8:30am; unless enrolled in OSHC. The before school yard duty teacher doesn't commence until 8:30am. If you need to drop your student at Vale Park before 8:30am please contact OSHC. What's been happening in Room 10 this term!

With such a busy start, here's some of the things we have been working on this term.

In Art, Room 10 have been looking at the artist Van Gogh and the colours and techniques used in his paintings. We have been focusing on self portraits and floral art based around his famous paintings 'Sunflowers' and 'Starry Night'

In maths we have been focusing on using informal measuring materials such as unifix cubes and nature to sort and order items from shortest to longest. We worked in pairs to measure the length of our bodies and to see who was shorter than us or taller in the classroom.

In daily 5 we have added a new station focusing on Vocabulary and having an understanding towards words that are unfamiliar.

Room 16 'Eggsperiment' Year 6-7

This week in Room 16 we have been looking after our own eggs.



We must take full responsibility for them and give them a face, a name, a toy to play with, an interesting book and two outfits each. We also have to use STEM to design a safe carrier/home for our eggs. Some students were given twins or an egg that already had a crack. We must stay with our eggs at all times or hire an egg sitter if we leave them. We only have a limited amount of money so we must budget and create a financial statement showing our spending on our egg.



This is a task that teaches us to be careful and take responsibility for our things. We have to write a reflection each day on how the day went and what we can improve on for the next day.

These are some eggs that have suffered injuries

If our egg gets broken, we have to fill out an accident report form stating whether it was an accident, neglect, abuse or carelessness. We have to provide our egg with proper medication such as bandaids and ice packs.


