

# Are you interested in hosting a Korean student?

In July/August 2019, Vale Park Primary School will again be involved in hosting Korean students (arriving 30/07/2019 and departing 16/08/2019). A group of students aged between 11-13 years of age will be here and we will need homestays for three weeks. Homestay parents receive approx. \$300 per week. Only one child is allowed per homestay.

If you are interested in supporting these Homestay students, you will need to have a home visit to assess your facilities. Each homestay student is expected to have their own room.

All homestays involving children must have a DCSI Relevant History Screening Check (Criminal

All homestays involving children must have a DCSI Relevant History Screening Check (Criminal History Check) for every adult in the home over 18 years of age.

Additionally, all homestay parents must undertake Responding to Abuse and Neglect training. This is a two hour online course. Please contact the Front Office staff to have this link emailed to you.

Please return the tear off slip below to the Front Office by **12**<sup>th</sup> **April 2019** to indicate your Expression of Interest. An expression of interest is not a guarantee of being approved to be a homestay family.




Students have been kicking goals in Room 14 to emphasise the importance of setting personal goals and putting in every effort to achieve these set goals.





We have also worked on creating our own mindmaps to visually represent who we are as unique individuals through the use of both words and illustrations.

# **NUT AND ALLERGENS POLICY**



#### CONTEXT:

Department for Education (DfE) schools are required to provide learning environments that are safe and supportive of all students. This includes providing for the needs of students and staff who may have anaphylactic (severe allergic) conditions – including nut allergies. For these individual's exposure to allergens at school may constitute a risk to their health and wellbeing.

While it is not possible to guarantee that the school environment will be completely free of potential hazards, risks can be minimised by compliance with reasonable guidelines.

Please note: initially this policy is written with nut allergies in mind and will be updated to include other potential medical hazards involving allergies as the need arises.

#### **PURPOSE**

- · To raise the awareness of anaphylactic conditions for all conditions for all members of the school community
- To provide a safe school environment for all members of the school community

### **MANAGEMENT**

#### Parents:

- Are requested NOT to send food to school that contains nuts, especially peanuts. This includes products such
  as peanut paste, "Nutella", nuts, peanut cooking oil and other foods that may contain nuts
- · Will be informed of this policy at the commencement of each new school year and at enrolment
- If a child has an allergic medical condition diagnosed by a health professional the school must be supplied with their prescribed medication in the original labelled pharmacy container, along with the appropriate medication authority and health action plan

# Students:

- Are encouraged to wash hands after eating
- Who bring food containing traces of nuts or nut products, are required to eat that food away from the allergic students and must wash their hands thoroughly before going to play

## Staff:

- · Will be made aware of students who have anaphylactic responses, including nut allergy
- Will supervise students during lunch eating time and will be vigilant in regard to this policy
- Will participate in training from approved providers as mandated by the Teacher Registration Board to understand procedures related to Anaphylaxis (severe allergic reactions) as the need arises

# School Canteen, SAKG, OSHC & Catered Events

- · Are required to comply with this policy
- Will not use foods which list nuts as an ingredient

# **EpiPens**

 Medication for all students that have anaphylaxis and have an EpiPen prescribed are kept in the Front Office in a cupboard that is readily accessible by all staff members

## **Promotion**

The policy will be promoted by:

- Information via the school newsletter
- New families to the school community being informed via information in their enrolment package
- Governing Council being informed and giving approval and support to this policy
- Staff being informed annually and provided with training opportunities
- · Students being informed via teachers, signs and through the newsletter


## Review:

This policy will be reviewed by staff and Governing Council every two years. The school acknowledges that
due to current food processing practices, it is impractical to eliminate nuts and nut products entirely from
an environment where there is food. The emphasis is therefore on raising awareness and
adopting the reasonable procedures re nut awareness.
