I hope all the mums had a Wonderful Mothers Day and loved the cards that the children made. They took a lot of growth mindset and perseverance to get them finished but I am sure you will agree they looked fabulous and the children did an amazing job with their sewing.





In literacy we finished off our narrative stories and have produced some great books. We have been learning about hyperbole, which the children have really enjoyed using in their texts.

We have begun learning about writing persuasive texts and what makes a reasonable or unreasonable argument. We have also learnt that to get the reader to change their minds and agree with our point of view we must back up our arguments with evidence.

In math we have been learning about chance, using language such as, probable, likely, unlikely, 50/50, even chance, possible, impossible, certain, probability and outcome.

On Tuesday 7th May we enjoyed a performance by KESAB about reducing the waste sent to landfill. The children are keen to adopt some good practices in the classroom and reduce our landfill so it fits into this small bin every day. In order to aid us in our endeavours we are asking our family's to help us by sending us to school with food in reusable containers instead of waste plastic. We are also collecting our food waste such as apple cores for the compost bins.
