STEM Showcase

On Friday 16th August, we welcomed approximately 500 grandparents, family members and visitors from other schools to the 4th annual Vale Park Primary School STEM Showcase.

All classrooms were open to families to see, hear about and engage in STEM learning with their children and the gym hosted an incredible display of STEM work that has been happening at Vale Park Primary so far this year. There was a display in the library highlighting our commitment to wipe out waste and a book expo, in which many books were purchased and generously donated back to the school. Students served a sample of freshly cooked foods from the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden program and a market stall provided freshly harvested and baked foods for purchase.



Feedback given on the day and sent afterwards in emails and on our Facebook page was overwhelmingly positive – you told us that the learning progressions from Reception to Year 7 were evident, that the visual display of learning was exciting to see and that you're excited for what the future holds for your children.

Governing Council

Our Governing Council met in week 3. As you are aware we will have a new Principal in 2020. The Governing Council has nominated Judy Lamp as our parent representative to be part of the 4 person panel (along with a staff representative, an external principal, and the Education Director).

We continued to discuss our school development plan. You may have noticed (and the kids certainly have) the additional logs added to the nature play area. Next holidays we will continue with some additional improvements with some stepping pavers, plants and irrigation, and then more bark.

We are currently scoping up an Outdoor Classroom to provide an external all-weather teaching area that would provide more lunch protection also. We are looking into the feasibility of improving the running track, updating the netball court surface, etc.

Our cricket pitch will receive a mat covering it. Our long jump pit will be relocated / updated at some stage.

We did apply for a Community Sporting Grant (which is a bit of a long shot) to cover the basketball court which would provide shelter. Unlikely, but we'll see.

Thanks to the Fundraising Committee for funding the installation of the football goal posts. Please support the Fundraising Committee at the upcoming Father's Day stall (29th and 30th August).








ROOM 18

This term we have welcomed the remaining junior primary classes into kitchen, and some new volunteers. A number of our junior classes are short on volunteer help, which makes it difficult to cook with the entire class during some sessions.
